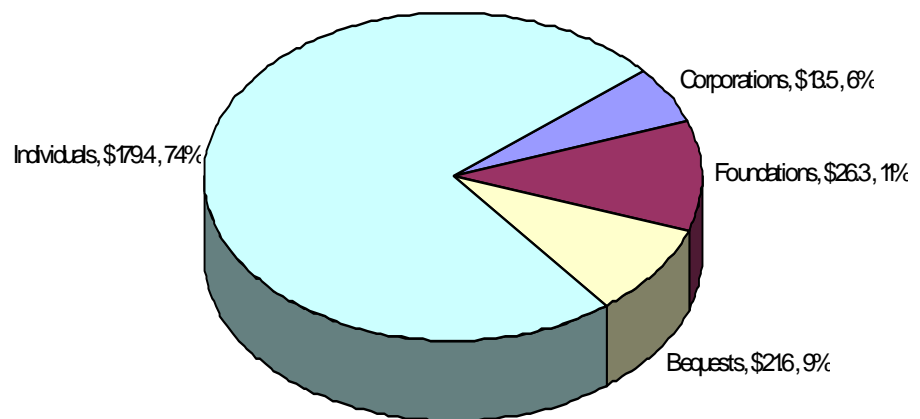




## WHERE IS THE MONEY?

In 2003, around \$240 billion was given away in charitable donations from four sources: individuals (when alive), bequests (when dead), foundations and corporations. This represents approximately one-fifth of all money going into the pockets of nonprofit groups. The remaining four-fifths comes from other "non-charitable" funding, including government grants, fee-for-service, interest earned, etc.

When looking at the entire spectrum of charitable giving, the breakdown looks like this:
